

INTRODUCTION

Pondicherry Multipurpose Social Service Society (PMSSS) is a registered Non Governmental Organisation established in the year 1977. The area of operation are Pondicherry and Karaikal regions of the Union Territory of Puducherry, Cuddalore and Villupuram Districts of Tamilnadu.

To establish a community based on Love, Iustice. Peace and Brotherhood.

PMSSS works with the Option for the Poorest of the Poor in the communities such as Women, Disabled, marginalized, un reached, agricultural landless laborers, marginal and small farmers, destitute, rural artisans, dalits, un organized daily laborers, fisher folks, etc., for mobilizing them into their own organization for self-reliance and sustainability with specific reference to gender, equality and equity

RELIEF PROGRAMME



PMSSS's one of the basic thrust area is to provide relief services to the people in the Archdiocese of Pondicherry and Cuddalore. During this year, relief

assistance to the tune of ₹ 78,700 were given from the Archbishops' Relief Fund and other relief fund to the families of 11 villages affected by fire and floods

PEOPLE'S ORGANIZATION

PMSSS always had greater conviction in promoting People's Organization as a viable platform for People's Development. The development strategy of promoting People's Organisation by PMSSS proved its viability and feasibility towards socio-economic development of the poor especially, agricultural coolies, daily wage earners, women and youth. The Poorest of the Poor Project undertaken during the year 1990 sponsored by Caritas Germany facilitated the People's Organisation process.

Hence PMSSS promoted following People's Organizations:

- Fraternal Life Sabha (FLS) comprising of grass root level FLC's (Credit Union).
- Small Farmers Development Society (SFDS) for the Landless.
- Thirukudumba Housing Development Society (THDS) for the Homeless.
- Sago Dharma Sabha (SDS) for Aged and Sick.
- Village, Panchayat Union, Taluk and District level Federation for women and farmers through New Thrust Programme.

- Kolping Families for youth.
- Neighbourhood communities for Childern, youth, women and Men.

FRATERNAL LIFE COMMUNITIES (FLC's)

PMSSS through leadership training formed rural based credit unions namely Fraternal Life Communities. The village level FLCs are federated into 10 zonal federations and promoted at the diocesan level as Fraternal Life Sabha (FLS). FLS had been registered as a society by PMSSS in the year 1994. The FLCs are engaged in mobilizing savings from members and utilizing for their Devlopment. They also involve in socio economic development activities like self employment, Income Generation, Life Insurance etc.

FLCs function with 12,824 members in 320 groups and mobilized savings of $\stackrel{?}{\sim}$ 4,20,32,605.

- a) Under Self employment program, 320 FLCs were extended SEP assistance to the tune of ₹12.00.000
- b) FLCs members renewed their premium under JBY Insurance Scheme of LIC. During this year 1574 persons are insured and 2 persons received death claim of ₹ 60,000.
- c) Under Educational Scholarship, 203 FLCs members received assistance to a value of ₹ 2,43,600.



LAND FOR LANDLESS



Land for Landless program started in 1990 bv PMSSS. later evolved as а Registered People's Organization namely, Small Farmers **Development Society**

(SFDS) in 1994. This program, over a period of 16 years purchased 233.05 acres of land to 324 landless agriculture coolies of FLCs members. Land for landless has a membership of 324 small and marginal farmers and mobilized savings of ₹ 4.93 Lakhs. Not only lands were provided but also bore wells, pump sets, tractor, power tiller, power sprayer and other equipments for agriculture development made available.

Land for Landless issued $\ref{1,22,12,550}$ as loan cumulatively and $\ref{77,06,906}$ had been repaid by the beneficiaries.

HOME FOR HOMELESS



Home for Homeless programme started in 1990 by PMSSS later evolved as a Registered People's Organization, namely Thirukudumba Housing Development Society (THDS) in

1994. Home for Homeless was started with the sole aim to build low cost houses for people living below poverty line and the daily wage labourers who are members of FLCs.

In 16 years period, Home for Homeless was able to provide assistance to 284 agricultural

coolies in Pondicherry and Cuddalore Archdiocese for construction of low cost houses. Home for Homeless has a Membership of 320 small and marginal farmers with savings of ₹ 2.85 lakhs.

Home for Homeless issued ₹ 55,99,000 as loan cumulatively and ₹ 34,45,236 have been repaid by the beneficiaries. The beneficiaries now have safe dwelling place to live in a better environment conditions.

SOCIAL ASSISTANCE

The Social
Assistance program
of PMSSS started
in 1990 later
emerged into a
Registered People's
Organisation namely
"Sago Dharma
Sabha" in 1994, to



assist the underprivileged and discriminated aged in the Archdiocese of Pondicherry and Cuddalore. Social Assistance with the help of volunteer contact persons extended initially assistance to 183 aged and sick people every month. In 1990 the number went upto 620 aged people with ₹ 100 per month as pension.

Now, on an average 460 aged, sick, handicapped widows and abandoned are getting social assistance through SDS every month.

Social Assistance has mobilized people's contribution to the tune of ₹ 42.45 lakhs.

Present year activities:

- During this year 17 aged were facilitated to receive govt. pensions.
- 381 beneficiaries received assistance to the tune of ₹ 3,81,900.
- One of the SDS patron member contributed

- ₹ 1,75,005 through his death ceremony as his last wish.
- General Health camp was conducted for the aged with the help of Sri Venkateswara Medical College, Puducherry.

Future Thrust:

- To conduct general health camp for aged and sick.
- To observe elders day
- To conduct awareness program on care & concern of elders especially for youth and children.

NEW THRUST PROGRAMME

The New Thrust Program (NTP) is a common program implemented in 22 Diocesan Social Service Societies in Tamil Nadu and Pondicherry, coordinated by TamilNadu Social Service Society (TASOSS), funded by Misereor, Germany. This program was started in the year 1999 to form and strengthen the federations of women, agriculture labourer and fish workers at Union, Taluk and districts level to become self reliant and self sustaining people's empowered movement in the region. The program crossed III phases and currently in the IV phase.

4th Phase New Vision:

Excluded Communities in (Public Action) for Social Transformation (Inclusion)

Nanayam Porulathara Valarchi Kuzhu (People's Bank) :

The CBO members from 6 Unions invested ₹ 9,06,100 as a share capital to initiate people's bank namely Nanayam Porulathara Valarchi Kuzhu. The objective is to develop economic status of the women in a sustainable manner. The members utilize the share capital specifically to start / develop the existing small entreprise.

at Puducherry. More than 5000 women took part in this event from all over Tamil Nadu and Puducherry. Puducherry State Hon'ble Minister for Social Welfare and Co-operation, Mr. M. Kandasamy was the Chief Guest. Most Rev. Dr. Antony Anandarayar, Archbisop, Vicar General Rev.Fr. P. Antonisamy, TASOSS Director Rev. Fr. A. Xavier, PMSSS Director Fr. V. Albert Thambidurai, Uppalam MLA Thiru. A. Anbazhagan, Puducherry Municipal councillors Federation President Mr. A. Anibal Nehru, Puducherry Women Commission Chairperson Mrs. S. Kamalini and Petit Hr. Sec. School Principal Rev. Fr. John Bosco honored the celebration.

Group Life Insurance (JANASHREE BIMA YOJANA):

NT group members have taken Group Life Insurance Policy under LIC JBY scheme, by paying ₹100 every year. This year totally 3,380 members have taken the policy.

Under JBY schemes, 7 persons got Death claims to the tune of $\stackrel{?}{}$ 2,55,000 which has been disbursed to the deceased family members.

Bank Loan assistance:

71 groups in Puducherry, Karaikal and Cuddalore districts have received loan to the tune of ₹ 1,30,17,600 for Income generation activities.



Outcomes:

• The NTP interventions enabled the members to own their federation and work democratically for their comprehensive

development.

- The new vision gave them economic sustainability through IGP / EA activities.
- The union level CBOs have taken up issues affecting their rights.
- The identified RSOs for the new concept have been accepted by all stakeholders.

KOLPING PROGRAMME



K o l p i n g programme was started in the year 1984 with an aim to promote spiritual, social, economical, political, cultural values and savings

among youth groups in the Archdiocese. Kolping groups and members have realized their roles and responsibilities in promoting social cause for the betterment of self, family and society. The program has promoted 84 kolping family groups with 1772 members and mobilized savings to the tune of ₹ 78,64,804.

- a) 76 kolping members received Self employment assistance to the tune of ₹ 2,50,000
- b) 407 Kolping members have taken Jana Shree Bhima Yojana LIC policy
- c) 34 kolping members received educational scholarship to the tune of ₹ 61,200

HOME FOR THE MENTALLY ILL

PMSSS came across people with disabilities

and mental illness in its target areas. Mentally challenged people are turned out of their homes and they are found roaming in the streets having no one to care for.



PMSSS thought that it would be a noble service if these people are taken care off. Hence, PMSSS decided to rehabilitate these people by starting a Home for them and it has been named as Fraternal Life Service Home for mentally ill (FLSH). The Home was established in Ousteri (situated 11 kms away from Pondicherry) in the year 1983. Initially it was started with 10 mentally ill patients who were picked up from the streets. FLSH has been designed as a transit home where people with mental illness are admitted, given treatment in Pondicherry General Hospital and Jawaharlal Nehru Institute of Postgraduate Medical Education and Research (JIPMER), and sent back to their home once they become normal.

FLSH is the only home available within districts of Pondicherry & Karaikal, Cuddalore and Villupuram Districts of Tamil Nadu for the rehabilitation of the mentally ill. The home continuously provide medical care, love and concern to more than 1035 mentally ill persons for more than 27 years, irrespective of caste and creed with the support of local and International resources. During this year 103 persons have been given treatment.

COMMUNITY HEALTH PROGRAMME

The health program was started 30 years



ago with support extended by Fr. Mahe of MEP. The project aims at helping the poor sick people in the Archdiocese of Pondicherry and Cuddalore to avail

medical care towards any disease. The services of the program are extended to people from other diocese too.

Every year general medical camps, eye camps and awareness programmes on health are conducted in the villages with the help of both govt. and private medical colleges and hospitals sponsored by Vanakkam Foundation, Germany.

108 people from 8 villages and 1280 people from 6 villages have been benefited in the general medical camp and eye camp respectively. The program also incorporated the Kalaignar Kappeedu Thittam during this financial year through which 7 persons have undergone bye pass surgery and operated successfully.

During this year 802 persons from Pondicherry and Cuddalore Archdiocese and 47 persons from other diocese received medical care and treatment.



Activities jointly carried out by PMSSS and Tamil Nadu Voluntary Health Association(TNVHA)

Workshop on Social Exclusion:

PMSSS in association with TNVHA

conducted a workshop on social exclusion for the Directors of the voluntary organizations. More than 27 functionaries participated in the workshop.



Convention and Rally:

A convention and Rally on 'Exclusion of Single Women' was organized by PMSSS on 22.12.2009 in which more than 107 single women participated in the procession / protest rally demanding financial assistance and job opportunities. Hon'ble Minister for Social Welfare, Govt. of Puducherry. Thiru. M. Kandasamy was the chief guest. The Minister promised to collect data of single women and take action to extend all needed help. Mrs. Saulina Arnold and Dr. John from TNVHA, Mrs. Shanthi, Secretary, Social Welfare Board, Mr. Balamurugan from Pondicherry Aids Control Society and NGO heads took part in the Rally.

Catholic Health Association of Tamil Nadu (CHAT)

One day practical training on Naturotheraphy was conducted in Naturotheraphy centre run by Clearition priests of Kakkanur. 8 program coordinators participated.

One day training program on Prevention and Rehabilitation of Disability was conducted in St. Joseph of Cluny hospital, Puducherry. 14 NGO heads participated and benefited.

COMMUNITY BASED REHABILITATION PROGRAMME (CBR)



CBR program with the support of Caritas India and coordinated by CBR Forum Bangalore, continues to help the differently abled to gain their rights with a

comprehensive development in socio – economic status for more than 10 years. The objective of the project is to identify physically and mentally challenged, to impart awareness on health, education, skill, to promote Self Help Groups and federation for effective advocacy and lobbying, to attain self sustainability and to gain rights at all levels. Every year the CBR workers are given special training by ADD India, Trichy.

Health Education on disability:

In order to promote the concept 'a world without disability', PMSSS in association with Maternity Hospital, Puducherry conducted a program for 214 pregnant mothers, family heads, and youth on prevention of disability, nursing disabled children and rehabilitation of disabled persons. 227 disabled family members were given awareness on the significance of education. As an outcome 19 disabled children have been admitted in schools and hostels for continuing education. Continuous monitoring is done and reporting to the School heads by PWD federation leaders for providing clean and safe environment for students. Students who completed their graduation have been registered in Disability Section of Employment Exchange.

Livelihood:

Loan assistance for 43 persons to the tune

of ₹ 9,55,000 have been availed for taking up petty trades and expansion activities. In addition 4

persons have been employed in private firms indulging in shoe manufacturing, textile showroom, and computer hardware. 3 students received free computer education.



Advocacy and lobbying:

The PWD group members with the support of federation leaders continue to advocate with the policy makers and implementers for their various rights



and demands on the basis of NT Act guidelines. These groups continue to highlight their demands through protest, road blocking and have been succeeded in getting monthly assistance for mentally and physically challenged persons.

AGRICULTURAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

Agricultural Development Program aims at avoiding distress sale of agricultural procedures and promotes profitable marketing for small and marginal farmers. Farmers are given awareness education on sustainable agriculture, marketing trends and extended loan assistance for storing the produces at harvest season through FLCs and organize cooperative marketing to gain value addition to the products. The Program had

been sponsored by Andheris Hilfe - Germany, Shantidama-France, Manos Unidas - Spain.

KOLPING MATRICULATION HIGHER SECONDARY SCHOOL

PMSSS started Kolping Matriculation School in 2004 with the support of International Kolping Society, Germany and Kolping India, Chennai. The school underwent many developments and up gradation during recent years. The school is upgraded into higher secondary in 2007, educating more than 1300 students. The school functions as one of best schools in imparting quality education to



the students in rural Puducherry having Rev. Fr. S. Chinnappan as its Principal and Rev. Fr. V. Albert Thambidurai, as Correspondent.

KALVARYAN TRIBAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

PMSSS extended its service to the tribal communities in Thoradipet and Pottiyam panchayats in Villupuram district of Tamil Nadu. In Mayampadi village of Pottiyam panchayat, PMSSS runs an Elementary school and give education to 58 tribal family children.



REHABILITATION AND DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME FOR THE SRILANKAN TAMIL REFUGEES



PMSSS with the support of CRS, provided relief and rehabilitation services to the refugees. Leadership and Skill training, Medical rehabilitation, Water and Sanitation, Electricity facilities, etc. are organized to the Srilankan Refugees accommodated in 4 camps located in Kurinjipadi, Kattumanarkoil, Virudhachalam and Kullanchavadi of Cuddalore district.

During the year 659 adolescent girls, youth and women Self Help Group members from these camps were given various trainings on

- Youth coordination
- Youth Parliament
- Nursing
- Hardware servicing
- Lab Technician
- Incense sticks making
- Mushroom cultivation
- Tailoring
- Embroidery and Handicrafts
- EDP.



INTEGRATED COMMUNITY MOBILIZATION THROUGH COMMUNITY BASED DISASTER PREPAREDNESS PROGRAMME



P M S S S continues to work in the tsunami hit 20 coastal villages. Many relief and rehabilitation measures have been provided to bring back the normalcy of the target population

through the Tsunami Response program.

In the second phase of community mobilization program PMSSS promoted Neighborhood Community concept for children, youth, women, and men for community mobilization focusing on disaster management in the coastal districts of Pondicherry, Karaikal and Cuddalore.

At the end of third year of the community mobilization program, the community structures are strengthened to take up and handle village problems such as laying roads, street lights, construction and repair of overhead water tanks, bridges, bus shelters, local transport facilities. The NCs took up social issues like commercial sex, school drop outs, marriage registration, etc. with the participation of the PRI leaders. Financial linkages were established with nearby micro and macro financial and banking institutions for the socio economic development of the target people. They were enabled to critically assess and prioritize

their present needs and prepare short and long term action plans for their self reliant and sustainable development.



Outcomes:

MICRO FINANCE PROGRAMME TO WOMEN SHG MEMBERS FOR WOMEN DEVELOPMENT - GIVE 2 ASIA



P M S S S sensitized the SHGs in Akkaraigori village of Cuddalore District on the support extended by Give 2 Asia for enhancing the livelihood option for the women.

The SHG women were also given EDP training and prepared them towards undertaking various potential small entrepreneurship activities which will fetch viable income resources for the women folk and bring tangible development for the individual, family and community at large.

On 23.3.2009 a grant agreement was signed by PMSSS and Give 2 Asia to receive Kristi Anderson Tsunami Women and Children Fund. Accordingly 103 members from 6 SHG's were identified and the revolving fund was disbursed for undertaking small trades.

REFORESTATION AND COASTAL AREA PROTECTION (ReCAP)

A pilot project named Reforestation

and Coastal Area Protection (ReCAP) was implemented in 3 villages since 2007 with the support of Caritas India. The program objective is to restore the coastal habitats and to enhance the livelihood



of the local fisher folks. Care Earth, Chennai acted as a consultant in providing technical support for the project.

Objectives:

- To prepare and enhance the capacities of local communities to promote/sustain coastal ecology as a means of disaster preparedness.
- To develop a replicable methodology for the implementation and monitoring of socioecological interventions that mitigate the effects of disasters.
- To establish a centre of competence for coastal protection to support the replication and expansion of the effort.

Activities:

- Creation of awareness through formal and inform systems and tools.
- Forming task forces.
- Enhancing capacities to ensure sustainability.
- Situational Analysis.
- Landscape Assessment.
- Providing scientific inputs for community mobilization.
- Visit to model restoration places.
- Herbarium collection.
- Creation of database.
- Establishing Competency Centre for Coastal Area Protection.



Outcomes:

- The concept and practice of restoration of natural habitats mainstreamed into local development paradigms.
- Local level skilled task force for coastal protection evolved.
- Networking with diverse user groups initiated multi-species reforestation (littoral forest) found viable and acceptable.
- Nursery techniques for littoral forest and mangrove species standardized.
- Methodology for restoring and monitoring sand dunes established.
- Centre of competence for coastal protection established.

SURAKSHA (WOMEN AND CHILD PROTECTION)

Suraksha in Sanskrit means Protection. After the completion of Bhavisya Transition program which centered around protection of children after Tsunami supported by USAID, CRS wanted to develop into full scale protection program holistically addressing and preventing HIV/AIDs and the trafficking/exploitation of women and children across South India. Hence Suraksha program was started in the year 2006

and presently the program is in the third phase. The program is implemented in 28 villages of Pondicherry, Karaikal and Cuddalore districts with an objective to create



an improved system and support mechanism at different levels for developing a resilient community through participatory governance.

The team had discussion with the experts and the community members at Solai Nagar South to study the success of ICT.

Campus Interview by HCL Info Systems:

HCL Info Systems, Sedarapet, Puducherry in association with PMSSS organized a campus interview at PMSSS, Puducherry for the students who studied at PMSSS Village Resource Centers, Village Knowledge Centers and Computer Education Centers. 42 rural youth were recruited in HCL.

Free Marriage Registration Camp:

Marriage registration camp was conducted at Abishegapakkam Village by PMSSS, ISRO Village Resource Centre, Thavalakuppam on 25th April 2010. The program was organized in collaboration with UTP Legal Aid Services Authority, Puducherry. The advocates from the UTP Legal Aid Services verified the documents and registered 72 families. The Panchayat and the Community Members showed keen interest to register their marriage.

ISRO - PMSSS - Expert Centre Connectivity:

Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO), Bangalore has expanded the satellite connectivity to PMSSS. Thavalakuppam Village Resource Centre (CRC) will act as an Expert Centre to disseminate community development programs. The ISRO Satellite connectivity is extended every Wednesday between 3.30 pm to 5.30 pm.

E-Learning honoring program:

BSNL and Rainbow TV organized a program on 18th July 2009 to honor the teachers for their valuable services and the students of e-Learning program who scored more than 70% in 10th and 12th Std. public exam.

NASSCOM Knowledge Network Partners Meet:

A team of staff members attended NASSCOM Knowledge Network (NKN) partners meet at NASSCOM Foundation, Delhi. Partners from various states participated and shared their activities. PMSSS won a cash award for ₹ 1500 for a case study presentaltion on its achievements through VKC.

Software and Technology Donation to NGOs:

NASSCOM Foundation, the social wing of National Association of Software and Services Companies (NASSCOM), has donated hardware and offered teleconferencing services to PMSSS to enable the technology reach rural areas at minimum cost. An event was organized on Software and Technology Product Donation to NGOs. More than 28 NGOs participated and applied for Big Tech Program. - To widen the economic, educational base of the

- coastal youth through alternate employment skill training and computer education programme.
- To enable the women to utilize the alternate livelihood options in tailoring to widen their socio economic status.

Outcomes:

- ABL becoming a successful and workable model.
- Performance in academics and extra curricular activities, attitude, aptitude increased.
- Fishing community children are exposed to wider opportunities.
- In youth Skill training, 127 youth completed Electrician, A/C Refrigeration and Auto mobile mechanism courses.
- 17 youth got employment opportunities in local private concerns with starting salary of ₹1500 to ₹ 3000 per month.
- 29 students joined in ITI, Polytechnic, Arts and Science graduation courses received educational scholarship for their higher study.
- Coastal women learned alternate skills in garment making.
- Income status of fisher women increased.



INTEGRATED COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME THROUGH HEALTH AND SANITATION

Building Healthy and hygienic Coastal Community through enhanced sanitation practice, Water Purification Plant and Implementation of Solid Waste Management Programme was commenced in the year 2009 with an objective of improving the living conditions of the 2 Tsunami affected villages of Pattinacherry and Keezhakasakudimedu in Karaikal District, where SCCF constructed Permanent Shelters.

Inauguration of Water Purification Plants:



On 08.02.10 the water purification plants were inaugurated in both the villages. In Pattinacherry Mr. Nagaraj, Executive Engineer, PIA, Karaikal inaugurated the water purification plant in

the presence of Mr. Joseph, Project Officer, SCCF Pondy, Executive Director, PMSSS, General Manager PMSSS, Fr. S. Alphonse, Karaikal Parish Priest & V F, Ms. Kalarani, Counsellor and Village panchayat leaders.

In Keezhakasakudimedu, Mr. Abel Rosario, Deputy Collector, Karaikal inaugurated the plant in the presence of Mr. Joseph, Project Officer, SCCF Pondy, Executive Director PMSSS, General Manager PMSSS and village panchayat.

At present each family is taking 2 pots of water every day. The target village people are now drinking good hygienic water as that of Mineral water. In order to encourage people's participation in running and maintaining the water plants, the beneficiaries are required to contribute ₹ 2 per pot.

Installation and Implementation of Solid Waste Management
System:

The solid waste management shed was functioning



from October 2009 at Pattinacherry and November 2009 at Keezhakasakudimedu. The street beautifiers regularly collect the waste from the houses by door to door collection.

The collected waste is stored. The Waste is segregated as degradable and non-degradable. The degradable wastes are converted into compost to be used as manure.

Outcomes:

- Increased awareness on Best Sanitary Practices & Self Hygiene practices.
- Formation of Health committees to monitor their village health and sanitary practice.
- Safe and clean drinking water available for the families at any time.
- The village becoming models for safe environment.
- Acknowledgement of efforts by District administration.

INTEGRATED BIOTECHNOLOGY
INTERVENTIONS FOR SOCIETAL
DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME - SHRI
AMM MURUGAPPA CHETTIAR RESEARCH
CENTRE

In order to promote hazard free environment and to generate income through Vermi Compost, Mushroom cultivation, Charcoal Briquetting, and Clonal propagation of medicinal and economically important plants, this program is implemented in



association with the Department of Bio technology and with the support of Shri AMM Murugappa Chettiar Research Centre, Chennai in 11 villages of Cuddalore district. So

far 516 members from FLCs and SHGs were given training on the above said concepts and related project implementation. The CBOs have successfully initiated the related income generation activities. The program has planned to replicate in other villages for developing the socio, economic base of the people in rural areas.

BASELINE SURVEY AND REHABILITATION OF PERSONS WITH DISABILITY



PMSSS, with the objective to expand the services of the Fraternal life service home initiated a program in the year 2008 sponsored by Caritas Austria, to collect disability

data, to educate the communities on the causes of disability and rehabilitate persons with disability in the Archdiocese of Pondicherry and Cuddalore.

Baseline survey conducted and data relating to caste wise segregation of disabled persons, types of disability, persons with more than one disability, socio, economic and educational background, persons availing/not availing govt. assistance, persons who are in need of govt. assistance are compiled.

The program has planned to facilitate PWDs to avail their rights through social action programmes,

facilitate them to obtain govt. assistance for self employment towards socio economic development.

COMMUNITY BASED DISASTER RISK MANAGEMENT PROGRAMME

PMSSS, with the support of UNDP and Department of Revenue and Disaster Management, Puducherry, implemented CBDRM program in 71 villages, 78 wards and 1 district. MoU was signed by PMSSS to undertake consultancy services to prepare Disaster Management (DM) plans. Accordingly on May 2009, PMSSS submitted DM Plans to the District Administration of Puducherry for effective management of future disasters.

VAZHNDHU KATTUVOM (VK)

Vazhndhu Kattuvom program has been

implemented with the support of Govt. of Tamil Nadu for the development of differently abled persons and vulnerable people living below the poverty line. Since 2008 PMSSS has been appointed as



Block Disability Facilitating Agency for Nallur Block of Cuddalore district. Based on the experience of Nallur Block, PMSSS was assigned to take Chinna Salem Block of Villupuram District from 2010 March onwards.

The programme undertakes the following activities

- Collection of differently abled persons data
- Identification of the needs of the differently abled persons through need assessment camps.
- Formation of SHGs for differently abled and for vulnerable people and link them with banks for savings and loan.

- Providing facilitation services to the eligible disabled persons to get National Identity card or BDFA ID cards to avail Government schemes.
- Organizing skill training and medical camps in the target areas.

The programme has identified 4677 differently abled persons from 3565 BPL families.

TAMIL NADU CORPORATION FOR DEVELOPMENT OF WOMEN WELFARE -MAHALIR THITTAM

PMSSS got affiliation with Tamil Nadu Corporation for Development of Women Ltd., since 2008 (Mahalir Thittam). Through this project activities like, New group formation, Animator & Representative Training, Self Help Group Members' training and creating linkages with financial institutions, organizing to receive Revolving Fund and facilitating to under go skills training are carried out. The members avail government schemes and benefits through which the women are enabled to enhance their economic base.

New Group Formation (Rural & Urban):

93 SHGs in Rural and 30 SHGs in Urban locations have been newly formed during this year.

Credit Linkages:

- Availed Revolving Fund to 76 groups to the tune of ₹ 45,60,000
- Received Direct Loan to 69 groups to the tune of ₹ 47,55,000

Outcome:

- The excluded and vulnerable members in the society joined together and formed new Self Help Groups.
- Direct Loan and Economica1 Activity Loan. The members started doing small business and group economic activities.



POST TSUNAMI SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOOD PROGRAMME - IFAD

Post Tsunami Sustainable Livelihood program is implemented with the support of International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD). This program is implemented in 3 clusters comprising of 17 panchayats and 91 villages of Parangipettai and Kumaratchi Taluks of Cuddalore District through District Rural Development Agency and Tamil Nadu Corporation for Development of Women Welfare. PMSSS, guided by Resource NGO MYRADA, is facilitating this program since 2008.



The program so far collected data related to population, SHGs, Village infrastructures, banks, NGOs, Panchayat level federations, artisans, persons paying house tax,

etc. In addition, maps like village resource and vulnerability map have been prepared. Based on the data the govt. has sanctioned ₹ 4.25 laks for 17 panchayats for developing the infrastructure facilities of the villages.

CENSUS 2011

In the Census history of India, for the first time, voluntary organizations were involved in the census operation. All over India 30 NGOs were selected to impart trainings on Census operation. The programme is funded by UNICEF.

PMSSS was referred by ADD India to be one of the facilitating NGO for Pondicherry Union Territory. Accordingly Mr. K. Ramkumar Raj, Program Manager, Women and Child protection programme took part in the National trainer programme on 11th & 12th January 2010 at Mumbai. In continuation, Mr. S. Ravi, Disaster Management Programme Coordinator from PMSSS was selected as Master Trainer Facilitator (MTF) for Pondicherry Union



Territory to impart training to Master Trainers (MTs).

The Directorate of Census operation, Tamil Nadu conducted training programme for Master Trainer Facilitators (MTFs) from all over Tamil Nadu for 4 days from 17th to 20th February 2010.

TRAINING CENTRE FOR LIVELIHOOD PROMOTION (TCLP)

PMSSS with an objective to train and impart skills for sustainable livelihood options of the rural and coastal population established a training centre at Periyakalapet, Puducherry with



support of Caritas Austria through Caritas India.

The Livelihood training centre was officially inaugurated on 21st February 2009 by Honorable Chief Minister of Puducherry Thiru V. Vaithialingam, in the presence of Hon'ble Education Minister Thiru. M.O.H.F. Shahjahan, Archbishop Emeritus Most Rev. Dr. Micheal Augustin and Mr.Manfred of Caritas Austria. Since then various livelihood related training programs were conducted. Around 1038 persons have been trained on various coastal and agro based livelihood skills.
