Introduction :

Pondicherry-Cuddalore Archdiocesan Social Service Organization namely, Pondicherry Multipurpose Social Service Society (PMSSS) undertake various projects with the participation of the target people for the Welfare and Integral Development of all category of people.

PMSSS Origin and its Legal Status :

Social Action was started in the Archdiocese during the year 1967 and thereafter PMSSS was established in the year 1977 and continued to implement projects for the socio economic development of the Poorest of the Poor. PMSSS was registered under Societies Registration Act of 1860 having 6/77 as its Register Number and as well having registration under FCRA and 12A & 80G of the Income Tax Act and mobilize resources to carry out the people's development activities. The target people are Farmers, women, daily wage earners, orphans, destitute, scheduled class, backward class, most backward class people, tribal, youth, refugees, aged, sick, disabled, fisher folk and all people who are in distress.

PMSSS completes its 37th year of service and continues to work for the betterment of its target communities by promoting human values, multi folded approaches taken to address the socio economic needs of the poor, deprived, disadvantaged sections of the community, move towards Integrated social development through social education and awareness, take service approach to serve the suffering people and relieve them from the distress, continues to implement people centered development interventions through peoples organizations for attaining their rights, protection, capacity building and livelihood enhancement.

PMSSS Governing Body is happy to submit its Annual Report to the General Body for the year 2013 - 2014.

PMSSS Programmes and activities

Relief

PMSSS's one of the basic thrust area is to provide relief services to the people in the Archdiocese of Pondicherry and Cuddalore. During this year, relief assistance to the tune of Rs. 41,950 were given to 20 families of Eraiyur, Virudhachalam, Maruvai, Villianur, Vadalur, Krishnankuppam, Thuringikollai, and Sengadu.

Fraternal Life Communities

Fraternal Life Communities functions with a vision of promoting fraternity among communities with the objective one for all and all for one.

Guidelines for FLCs :

- The village level FLCs are federated to promote truth, workforce, love, trust, sacrifice, thrift, self sustainability, cooperative functioning at village and district level.
- To promote thrift and savings among members.
- To establish a linkage with govt. and financial institutions to promote Income generation activities among members.
- To promote individuals serving with social cause as leaders.

- Revolving assistance to the tune of Rs. 21,00,000 was given to 17 groups under IGP
- Insurance claim of Rs.3,30,000 has been handed over to 11 deceased members of the family.
- Training imparted on Accounting, Leadership and Management for the groups.
- Loans recovered from Land for Landless, Home for Homeless and Delayed Marketing programme are given as IGP loan .
- Bank Loan to the tune of Rs. 62,00,000 availed and distributed to 400 members of 20 FLCs.
- Students of Koonankurichi village started savings of Rs.2,000 per student in FLCs.
- FLCs continue to encourage & support 10th and 12th students, who placed in first three ranks through surplus gained out by the FLCs.
- During the year 68 FLC have conducted Annual general body meeting and contributed assistance to development fund of Sago Dharma Sabha, FLSH home, and Archbishop Relief Fund.

Sago Dharma Sabha

The Social Assistance program continues to assist the underprivileged and discriminated aged in the Archdiocese of Pondicherry and Cuddalore.

SDS activities:

- During the year 157 aged persons given assistance to the tune of Rs.1,10,000.
- 48 persons facilitated to receive govt. pension.


Sago dharma Sabha continues to work for the aged and sick with the generous contribution from Educational Insititutions, Parish Priests and PMSSS staff.

Activities through REACH – Akshaya :

TB awareness programme was conducted in 36 places in which 540 persons participated. 9 persons identified with TB have been given DOTS tablet and they are in continuous follow up.

TB Programme through Govt. of Puducherry:

PMSSS in collaboration with Pondicherry Govt. TB control society collects sputum and preserve it in Primary health care centre for identification of TB symptoms. Medical observation was conducted for 1129 persons and 27 persons identified with TB symptoms are given medical care and attention.

Tamil Nadu Voluntary Health Association(TNVHA) :

PMSSS has been selected as District Resource Centre and District Coordination Committee by TNVHA. Puducherry and Karaikal State level DDC meeting was held in which NGOs and Medical institutions participated. Orientation training programmes on Health and Medical camps were conducted jointly.

Catholic Association of Tamil Nadu(CHAT) :

PMSSS in association with CHAT established health centres in outreach villages for the benefit of down trodden and disadvantaged communities. At present CHAT concentrates on Alternative Medicinal Care.

Natural medicine, Accu puncture, Touch Therapy, Reflex Therapy trainings were imparted to CHAP members. At present CHAP members practice Natural medicine.

On 18.09.2013, Dr. Annie of Kodaikanal conducted training to 26 members of CHAP on Natural Medicine.

New Thrust Programme

Since 1999, with the support of Tamilnadu Social Service Society, the regional forum, the New Thrust Programme implemented in the Dioceses in Tamilnadu and Puducherry. NTP objective is to bring change in the community and the marginalized become Self - reliant and Self - sustainable people's organisation to take up rights based issues and enhance livelihood options.

Union CBOs Details:

572 CBOs are formed in 135 villages of Puducherry, Uzhavarkarai, Villianur, Muthaliyarpettai, Cuddalore, Kurinjipadi, Panruti, Annagramam, Parangipettai, Bhuvanagiri, Kammapuram Unions having 8094 members and mobilized savings of Rs. 97,29,650.

Special Activities:

- ♦ Resolutions passed in the women SHGs to include the differently able and their members of the family to join in the existing SHGs. The loan amount and the paying installments also increased for the disabled.
- ♦ International Women's Day was celebrated in Puducherry & Cuddalore where 350 SHG members and 470 members participated respectively. In this programme the Differently able persons performed cultural programmes. ♦ TASOSS facilitated the 16 Diocesan Social Service Societies to organize Base line survey with the SHG members and leaders to know the reality of the SHGs.

PMSSS with the sponsorship of BPRM & CRS implemented activities in 4 camps (Kurinipadi, Ambalavananpet, Kattumannarkoil & Vridachalam) of Cuddalore district and in 2 camps (Chinnasalem & Keezhputhupattu) of Villupuram district for the welfare of Srilankan Tamils.

Activities:

1. Construction of Shelters: At Chinnasalem camp 85 concrete houses were constructed and handed over to the Refugee beneficiaries on 12th October, 2013. Houses were handed over by Thiru. P.Mohan, Honorable Rural Industries Minister, Govt. of TamilNadu & distributed the keys to the beneficiaries in the presence of Mr. V. Sampath, District collector, Villupuram, PMSSS Director & staff, Municipal Chairman, Panchayat president, ward members & camp inmates.

In Cuddalore at Ramapuram, construction of 130 permanent shelters for Ambalavananpet camp residents got over and provision of basic facilities like road, drainage, over head tank, drinking water pipe line & street lights by the concerned government departments are under process .

2. Awareness Meetings:

Pudhuvazhvu –V was over in the month of September, 2013 and Phase-VI is in progress. In the 5th phase, awareness meetings conducted on the adverse effects of alcoholism, gender based violence and prevention methods. 217 men and 103 couples benefitted.

In the 6th phase, Makkal Nalvazhvu Kuzhu (Camp Protection Committee) was formed in 6 camps under PMSSS intervention. The main aim of forming camp protection committee is to sensitize the members to identify the issues of their camps and handle them and lobbying with government departments whenever the need arises.



Department of Science and Technology Project

Creating a healthy community and organizing Micro enterprises towards sustainable livelihood for the SC community families at Chinnanellikollai Village in Cuddalore District with the Support of Department of Science and Technology, Government of India. The project started its implementation from April 2012 and ends in May 2015.

Livelihood Support :

- Milch Animal worth of Rs. 2,25,000 for 15 womens distributed and out of which 15 Milch animals were insured to the tune of Rs. 17,160.
- Rs. 19,740 was spent on Fodder and Milk utensils for 15 women.
- Bio Pesticide and Vermi Compost shed was constructed with an estimated cost of Rs. 22,000
- Pesticide Sprayer worth of Rs. 19,500 distributed to 3 persons
- Kitchen garden promoted in 100 Households.

Sanitation :

- Low cost toilet constructed in 20 Households at a cost of Rs. 75,000.

EDP training :

- Tailoring training imparted to 20 women through Indira Social Trust, Sethiyathoppu.
- Educational Scholarship worth Rs. 31,500 for 5 students distributed
- 3 persons were trained in motor vehicle driving .
- Rs. 400 paid as assistance to 2 students for vocational skill training program

Training / Exposure :

- ⇒ One day training on natural farming, bio pesticide and preparation of Vermi compost conducted for 40 persons
- ⇒ One day training for 20 Women SHG on natural farming conducted in Chinnanellikollai village
- ⇒ 32 persons were taken to an exposure visit to KVK Farm in Virudachalam.
- ⇒ 6 days training on sustainable rural livelihood options for project coordinator conducted at Dharmasala, Karnataka
- ⇒ 2 days training on Ornamental fish breeding was conducted in Chennai in which 2 field staff participated.

Outcome :

- ❖ 15 women benefited through Milch animal program and earned Rs. 2000 per month as income.
- ❖ 20 SHG women are engaged in production of Bio pesticide and Vermi compost.
- ❖ 20 women undergone tailoring and enabled to take orders for stitching government school uniforms.
- ❖ Pond desilting done through Village Development Committee from their village corpus fund to the tune of Rs. 35000.
- ❖ Land size of 20' x 15' was donated by a beneficiary for setting up of Bio pesticide manufacturing and vermin compost unit.

Information & Communication Technology

INCOIS – WAVE RIDER BUOY

PMSSS carry out disaster preparedness activities from 2005. In continuation of this a Wave Rider Buoy was deployed at Pondicherry Coast to know about the wave height, wave direction, wind speed, wind direction. Last February'2014 a team of Experts from INCOIS – Hyderabad and NIO-Goa visited PMSSS serviced the Wave Rider BUOY and redeployed the BUOY at Puducherry Coast.

ISRO – Village Resource Center (VRC)

PMSSS in collaboration with Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO), Bangalore established Village Resource Center in the districts of Pondicherry -2, Karaikal -1, Cuddalore -2, Villupuram-1. In continuation, PMSSS has been announced as Expert Center and 3 new centers from Fisheries Department, Agriculture Department in Pondicherry and Fisheries Department from Mahe were added with PMSSS. Thiru. N. Narayanasamy, Minister for Parliament Affairs, Govt. of India and Dr. Radhakrishnan, Chairman, ISRO inaugurated the Expert Center. Using this Satellite Technology Tele-Education, Tele-medicine, Tele-Agriculture, Land and Water Resource Management will be conducted for the benefit of the people. Computer training, Tailoring training and various vocational skills also will be conducted through the VRC centers.

Entrepreneur & Skill Development Program

National Institute of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (NI-MSME) under Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises, Hyderabad had sanctioned 19ESDP program for this year. Each program 30 youth were trained. The students were mobilized from Pondicherry, Cuddalore and Villupuram Areas. Age limit is 19 – 40. In total 570 youth got trained under ESDP program. Certificates distributed to the course completed students.

NATIONAL SKILL DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION – STAR SCHEME

PMSSS in partnership with LAQSH Skill Training Academy, Bangalore conducting NSDC – STAR scheme program to the schools and college students. Students were trained on Telecom-Customer Care Executive and Retail – Trainee Associate training. Assessments were conducted by Sector Skill Council and NSDC.

Totally 1420 students from Puducherry, Padalesuwarar Polytechnic College-Cuddalore, St. Joseph's college-Cuddalore, Avvaiyar Government College for Women, Bharatidhasan Govt. College for Women, Puducherry, Tagore Arts College-Pondicherry, Joseph's College-Viluppuram, Paulsons College-Villupuram, St Joseph ITI - Cuddalore got trained under the scheme. So far 1270 passed out from the assessment. The passed out students get Rs. 1000 from NSDC.

NABARD – Cuddalore had sanctioned Training on Embroidery and Ariya Work program for 13days under Micro Enterprises Development Programme (MEDP) for SHGs. 120 women from Self Help Group registered and benefited from the program. 60% of the women employed in self and wage employment.

Indian Bank Self Employment Training Institute (INDSETI) under Ministry of Rural Development sanctioned skill training program on DTP (27), Computer Hardware & Network (33), Tally (25). In total 85 students were trained 70% of students are working in private sector.

BPO Training Program for Disable by Stitching Gilles Foundation, Belgium

PMSSS in partnership with Stitching Gilles Foundation conducted BPO training Program to educate and to give employment opportunities to the rural disabled youth.

90 days BPO Training Program aims to help the participants to understand the working culture in a BPO, basics in telephone etiquettes and other back office operations. The training also includes finishing courses in personality development, soft skills and exposure to internet among others. 75 students were trained and 65% of them working in various private sector Companies.

International Fund for Agricultural Development Assisted PTSLP

Post Tsunami Sustainable Livelihood program is implemented with the support of Tamil Nadu District Rural Development Agency and Panchayat Raj Department and International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD), Rome. The program is implemented in 3 clusters comprising of 17 panchayat and 91 villages of Parangipettai and Kumaratchi Taluk of Cuddalore District with an objective to promote women SHG and federate them at panchayat level for economic and social enhancement.

Target Population : Fisherfolk, Agricultural labourers, Women Federation members.

Activities: Training on MED,IGA,LIC, and Bank Loan imparted to 17 panchayat women SHGs.

- ✎ Training on milch animal rearing conducted from, 21st to 23rd September 2103 at Chinnasalam Block Development Office in which 20 physically challenged people participated.
- ✎ Training on EDP conducted from, 26th to 31st October 2013 at Villupuram. District Project Officer, 35 physically challenged people participated.
- ✎ Training on family healthcare and support conducted from, 13th to 30th February 2014 at Kallakurichi primary health centre. 15 physically challenged attended.

Livelihood training and assistance for widow, poorest of the poor and socially backward people

- 50 youth participated in Chinnasalem block level computer training at Chinnasalem from May 2013.
- 25 widows and 15 socially backward people received Milch animals at Chinnasalem block level.
- 63 persons received loan assistance to the tune of Rs. 3,66,320 for starting small enterprises.

Promotion and Development of Minority and Vulnerable Communities - Episcopale Conferenza Italiana

PMSSS implements socio economic development programs for the vulnerable community members such as **Dhobies, Ottars, Ilurars, Coblers, and agricultural labourers** with the support of Episcopale Italiana. PMSSS continues to work for these minority community members through coordinated and sustained intervention by capacitating them in developing their skills and with various livelihood activities.

Activities :

1. Employability support for 100 youth to the tune of Rs. 3,000,000
2. Integrated livelihood promotion for 100 elders to the tune of Rs. 5,00,000
3. Employability support for 100 women to the tune of Rs. 6,00,000
4. Construction of training centre for various trainings and livelihood support activities.

Outcome :

- ⇒ Training and economical assistance given encouraged and enabled the poor women, youth and men to realize their potential for taking up different alternate Income Generation Activities.
- ⇒ Income from the livelihood programs support their family, make their children continue higher education and live a dignified life by avoiding discrimination and oppression from other communities.
- ⇒ PMSSS under the Episcopale Conferenza Italiana project constructing a New Training centre for the Minority Community Development.

CBR Mainstreaming

Since 1977, PMSSS works for the socially deprived and economically deprived people. Among these marginalized people, the differently able people face different barriers and challenges. Even though Government provides schemes and benefits for the PWDs but still they are in poor situation. In order to bring changes in their life, the project facilitates them to overcome the physical barriers and attitudinal barriers so that they can get justice and can live as dignified persons in the society.

Project Activities :

- The VFs and Priests were given orientation on 10 types of disability and the concept of Mainstreaming in their Vicariate and Parishes. Core committee was formed among them which will help them to plan and share their activities carried out on the MS concept.
- The religious congregation heads and councilors were given orientation on 10 types of disability and the concept of Mainstreaming in their institutions. Core committee was formed among them which will help them to plan and carry out MS activities.
- The Seminarians were given orientation on 10 types of disability and the concept of Mainstreaming in the Parishes.
- Orientation trainings were conducted in 20 parishes on MS concept and Parish members actively participated.
- Trainings were given to village level DPO leaders on leadership, management of DPOs, Resource mobilization, rights, advocacy & lobbying and mainstreaming disability.
- The Child line team members were given training on Counseling to children with disabilities and their parents.

- State level Disability Advocacy Meeting was held on 28th June 2013 at Chennai where State level DPO Network leaders, State level Govt Officials and DPO representatives from different parts of the State participated. 2 DPO leaders and the programme organizer attended.
- 4 DPO leaders and Programme organizer attended one day workshop (31st March 2014) on **Consultation Workshop on Disability Bill** which was facilitated by Disability Rights Alliance and organized by Vasantham Federation & IRCDS in Thiruvallur District.
- Created awareness on Mainstreaming of disable on the World Disable Day events. In this programme PWDs needs, issues, ways and means for resource mobilization, importance of advocacy, Alliance Building & Networking were discussed.

Outcome of the Programme :

- ☛ The pious associations in Reddiarpalayam and Ulluthur Parishes organized 3 Wheel Chairs by which the PWDs could go into the church and participate in the worships.
- ☛ The PWDs actively participate in the church worships like mass reading, being in the choir, playing musical instruments and as altar boy.
- ☛ Some of the Parishes and schools have decided to make ramp for the PWDs.
- ☛ The core committee in three parishes decided to make monthly house visit to the PWDs' families where prayers and motivation could be given to them. In Villianur Parish 2 PWDs received walking stick through Vincent De Paul Society. In Tagore Nagar parish 8 PWD families & 22 MR children received Clothes and 5 Kgs of Rice through Vincent De Paul Society.
- ☛ Mr. John Peter and his companions participated in a talent show competition which was organized for differently able and telecasted by different mass media like SUN TV, GEMINI TV, UDAYA TV & in SURIYA TV CHAMPION show. They received cash prize for the programmes. The Mercury Channel at Puducherry gave ACHIEVEMENT award for it.
- ☛ Mr. John Peter and his team performed stage show with Cultural programmes and Yoga. During the Women's Day celebration in Puducherry & Cuddalore districts they were invited to perform stage show.
- ☛ With lot of difficulties and continuous advocacy and lobbying by the DPOs, 4 PWDs received 3 Wheeler Motor Cycle through MLA fund in Villupuram district.
- ☛ Networking with other DPOs, PWDs have taken issues in Puducherry to get their 3% reservation, form separate PWD's Commission, User friendly Free Cell phone, Monthly 30 Kgs of rice, allocating 3% Government Quarters for PWDs and so on.
- ☛ PWD members are included in the existing SHGs and also formed new groups only with the PWDs.

CHILDLINE 1098

CHILDLINE is India's first 24 hours, toll free, emergency phone outreach service for children in need of care and protection works with a vision of promoting child friendly Nation that guarantees the right and protection of all children. Childline is supported by the Ministry of Women and Child Development, New Delhi under the overall supervision and guidance of Childline India Foundation.

Calls / Intervention details :

Totally 2847 calls received from Childline 1098. 2250 calls received directly from Puducherry Childline and 597 calls received from Trichy Childline.

Project Intervention :

- ✎ Installation of CHILDLINE board by Auto drivers union at Mission Street and Rangapillai Street in Puducherry.
- ✎ On 14th November 2013, Childline Se Dosti Campaign was inaugurated by Mr. Deepak Kumar, I.A.S, District Collector of Puducherry. Around 75 children participated in the program
- ✎ On 16th November 2013, a day out programme for the children staying in the homes was organized for 86 children.

SURVEY OF WORKING CHILDREN(LESS THAN 18 YEARS) IN THE DISTRICT OF PUDUCHERRY:

CHILDLINE project team along with social work students of Pondicherry University jointly conducted a small survey to identify the presence of working children less than 18 years in the district of Puducherry. The survey was conducted with 106 children. Some of the important facts revealed through the survey :

- ♦ 26 children in the age less than 14 are engaged in child labour.
- ♦ 80 children are in the age group of 15 and less than 18
- ♦ 24 children discontinued studies after 8th Std.,
- ♦ 51 children discontinued studies after 10th Std.,
- ♦ 59 children work on daily wage basis with prime objective of supporting the family to settle the debts.
- ♦ 16 children experienced Physical abuse during work.

Staff Training :

2 Staff members attended Capacity Enhancement Training for Senior Functionaries of NGOs on Promotion and Protection of child Rights

Outcome:

- 79% of calls are directly received in emergency toll free number stationed in puducherry.
- Child issue based orientation programme conducted in 32 schools covering 3805 girl and 1269 boys.
- Campaigns focusing on child abuse and child begging was organized in several places around Pondicherry.
- Out of 288 cases supported 130 cases were identified through outreach and community level interventions and the remaining 158 cases reported through 24 hour emergency toll free number.
- 5 children found begging were rescued and enrolled in schools
- 56 child abuse cases were reported to CHILDLINE during the year as compared to 13 in the previous year.
- 5 child marriages got stopped.
- 12 dropouts children have been reenrolled in schools to continue education.
- 16 FIR filed during the year.
- Rapport strengthened with allied departments by recognizing the work of CHILDLINE team.

Fraternal Life Service Home for Mentally ill

The Home was established in Ousteri (situated 11 kms away from Pondicherry) in the year 1983 where people with mental illness are admitted, given treatment, rehabilitated and successfully integrated back in the society.

Impacts:

- More than 1800 mentally ill persons successfully treated.
- During the year, 160 persons were rehabilitated. 112 persons got recovered and joined back in their homes. At present 48 persons are staying as inmates in FLSH.

Construction of Chapel in FLSH:

With the support of Perol Alber family a chapel was constructed and inaugurated by His Grace Archbishop of Pondicherry and Cuddalore on 3.08.2013. The inmates and the neighbors offer their prayers regularly to help the mentally ill for their recovery and peace. PMSSS thanks the support of the Perol Alber family.

Legal Registration and Govt. Recognition:

FLSH registered under Disabilities Act. Registration Certificates issued by the Commissioner of Rehabilitation which will enable FLSH to receive support from Central and State govt. departments. Application was forwarded to the District Rehabilitation office, Cuddalore as an outcome of monitoring visit made on 06-11-2012 by Dr. K. Sathiyamoorthy, District Mental Health Officer, Cuddalore district and forwarded to the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment for grant eligibility.

Appreciation :

In Appreciation of services rendered by FLSH, Puducherry Mercury TV Channel awarded Best Service award to FLSH.

Livelihood Training Centre

PMSSS in collaboration with Department of Women Development, Govt. of Tamilnadu conducted various training for PLF for the restructured panchayats.

Details of the training:

1. 3 days residential training on Management and accounts training conducted for 1883 members.
2. 3 days residential training on Gender Equity conducted for 240 Panchayat leaders.
3. 3 days residential training on Gender Equity conducted for 2127 PLF leaders
4. 16 days training on CGS for 30 CLFs.

- Helped to peruse Technical education.
- Enabled to start own enterprise.

Usha Silai (Tailoring) School Project

PMSSS in collaboration with USHA International Ltd, New Delhi has implemented USHA Silai Schools project in the villages of Pondicherry Union Territory and Villupuram District. An MoU was signed for a period from April 2013 to November 2014 targeting Vulnerable and economic poor women to ensure and increase their income level.

Aim :

USHA Silai Schools aims to provide tailoring training to the Rural Women and issue free tailoring machine for starting their own small enterprise for enhancing their family income and standard of living.

Activities :

The following 3 activities carried out throughout the project

- ☞ Train at least 20 women in a year
- ☞ Stitching dresses with locally available resources.
- ☞ Sewing machine mechanism and training

After completion of the training, 30 women received freely distributed sewing machine with the support Usha International Ltd. In Pudcherry District, during June and September both Batch I & II women started Silai (Tailoring) schools in their village in presence of Executive Director, PMSSS. Totally 222 students were enrolled out of which 79 students completed the training. In Villupuram District, during January and February 6th both batch I & II women started the Silai Schools. At present 146 women undergoing tailoring training

Training on Value Addition :

15 USHA Silai School teachers attended 13 days Value Addition training in which Embroidery, Ariya work, Bridal Blouse and Saree making with the support from NABARD, Puducherry. The training helped and enabled the women to earn additional income.

Distribution of Certificate:

On 13.11.2013, training certificate were distributed to the 30 Usha silai School Teachers by Mr. Jayakumar, Former Deputy Director, Department of Rehabilitation of Srilankan Refugee, Thiru. Krishnan, Head ICICI, Coimbatore, Mr. Janarthanan, Regional Sale head, ICICI.

Income Status :

From April 2013 to March 2014, 60 women from both Puducherry and villupuram District have earned income through Silai Schools through which they were able to save, spend for children education, meet out family expenses and contributed for the development of Silai schools.

Later Silai Schools in Thengaittu and Sanniyasikuppam were visited and the team appreciated the work of women. On 22nd January 2014, during the review meeting, PMSSS was awarded a memento for the best practices of PMSSS promoted USHA Silai Schools.

☞ September 12th & 13th & December 18th 2013, monitoring visit was made by Mr. Vadivelan, Program coordinator to 8 silai schools.

☞ On 13.3.2014 & 14.3.2014, monitoring visit was made by Mr. Vadivelan, 17 schools in Puducherry and 3 schools in Karaikal Districts.

Kolping Matriculation Higher Secondary School

PMSSS started the Kolping Matriculation School in 2004 with the support of International Kolping Society, Germany and Kolping India, Chennai. Kolping school completed 10 years of its establishment. The school continues to function as one of best schools in imparting quality education to 1298 students in rural Puducherry having Fr. Chinnappan as its Principal and Fr. V. Albert Thambidurai, as Correspondent. During this year sports events and school annual day celebrated in which best performing students were felicitated. The school achieved 100% result in 10th and 12th Govt. Public Exams in this academic year also.

SCCF Ice Plant and Fish Pickle Unit

PMSSS with the support of SCCF constructed Ice Plant and Pickle making unit in Pattinacherry fishing village. Constant and continued efforts have been made by PMSSS to get govt. license from Fisheries Dept and Puducherry govt. In order to assess the progress of the project, SCCF appointed a team in which Mr. Manish, New Delhi, Dr. Kasim Chennai, Mr. Lindsay, Dindigul made a visit to the plant site and the allied departments and conducted a detailed assessment for 10 days and submitted report to SCCF. Further activities will be taken up based on the recommendations of the experts and SCCF.

Agricultural Development Project

Agricultural Occupation faces a set back due to the changing environmental and specifically due to disasters of cyclone. The livelihood means of agricultural people got adversely affected. In order to recover and strengthen the agricultural activities and to encourage alternate livelihood options, PMSSS with the Partnership of **Episcopale Conferenza Italiana** gave trainings and extended financial assistance to Minority community people. 100 families in 10 villages of Cuddalore and Villupuram districts got the assistance and undertaken various livelihood activities and enhancing their income resources. The activities undertaken are Agricultural farming, Milch cooperatives, Cell phone mechanic center, petty shops, brick making, hollow block making, snacks shop, Xerox center, Vegetable shop, fruit stall etc.

PMSSS with the Partnership of **Stitching Gilles, Belgium** extended livelihood assistance to cyclone affected agricultural families in 10 villages in Cuddalore district and relieved them from their distressed situation. Continuous trainings imparted on Sustainable agriculture, Nursery creation, Natural resource management, Social forestry, Bio-pesticide production, Milch animal cooperative management etc. and promoted farmers groups to strengthen the agriculture and its allied activities.

PMSSS with the partnership of **Roskob Foundation, USA**, reached out and assisted the agricultural coolie families in 10 villages. Promoted SHGs and extended financial support to 25 members for Goat Rearing, 25 members for Milch cow, 50 members for Petty Trades. EDP training imparted to strengthen their livelihood activities.

PMSSS New Training Centre

PMSSS in order to expand its ICT interventions and Vocational Skill Development training program for benefit of rural youth and women is constructing a New Training Centre in the PMSSS office complex. **Caritas Treviso, Italy** extend its partnership and financial support for the Training Center.

Kalvarayan Hills Tribal Development Project

PMSSS runs a middle school in Mayambadi village of Pottium Panchayat in Kalvarayan Hills. 44 Tribal Community Children are studying in the School. The school is run in coordination with DOS. PMSSS with the support of MCRC established RO water plant for the benefit of the school children and the Tribal community members.
