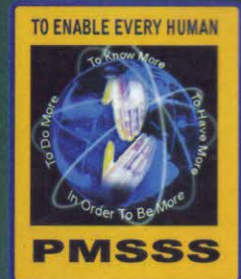
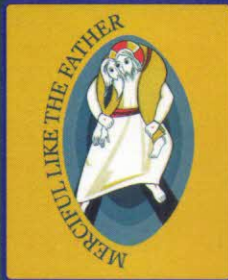

ANNUAL REPORT 2015-2016



PMSSS being the official social service organization of the Archdiocese of Pondicherry and Cuddalore continues to implement short and long term development programs for the welfare and well being of the people in its working areas of Pondicherry, Karaikal, Cuddalore and Villupuram Districts.

During these 39 years of service, PMSSS with its long term vision continues to light the hope in the lives of individual, family and community especially the poor, needy and the disadvantaged communities by creating awareness and conducting trainings to relieve themselves from the suffering economic situation and the vicious circle of poverty.

PMSSS interventions and active participation of the Governing Body and General Body helps in planning, implementing need based development programs for the welfare and development of the people in its areas of operation. PMSSS conducted 2 Governing Body Meetings and One General Body meeting during this year. At this juncture PMSSS Governing Body is happy to submit its Annual Report to the General Body for the year 2015-2016.

PMSSS Programme and Activities

Archbishop Relief Fund :

Every year through Hunger and Disease campaign the families who have affected by flood, fire, cyclone and other disasters are provided immediate relief assistance. During this year 66 families from Kottucherry, Krishnakuppam, Komedu, Karaikal, Nangathur, Pennadam, Panikankuppam villages were provided relief assistance to the tune of Rs.1,33,642.

Flood Relief :

During the month of November and December 2015, the operational areas of PMSSS were affected very much by heavy rain and floods. Many families lost their houses and properties. PMSSS with the support of agencies like Caritas, CRS, Manos Unidas, Spain, Caritas Trevisio, TASOSS, Diocesan social service societies, various Parishes and Dioceses, Corporate Agencies, Health and Educational Institutions and well wishers extended the relief assistance to the flood affected families. 17,000 families and 70,000 persons were given help.

Details of Materials :

Rice, Provisions, Tarpauline, Rope, Cooking utensils, Saree, Lungi, Towel, Spade, Bond, Bedsheet, Sanitary Napkin, Bathing soap, Umbrella, Detergent soap, Household utensils, Medicines, Educational materials were distributed by PMSSS.

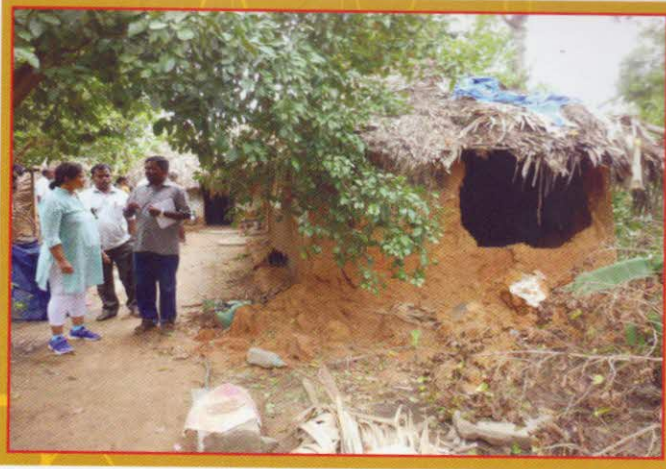

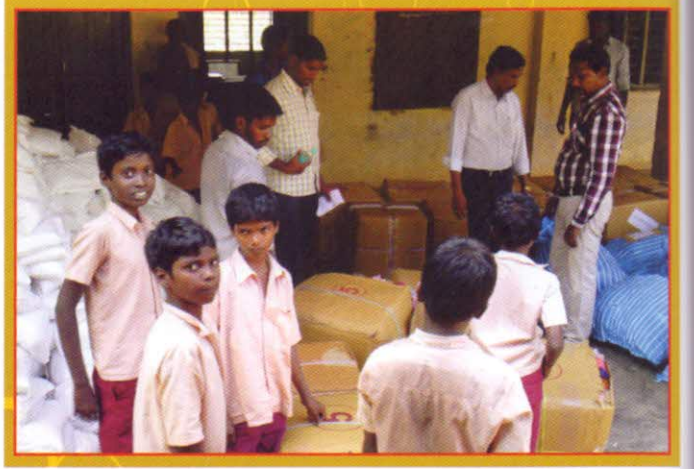

Flood Recovery- Shelter Assistance Program :

After the relief phase Caritas India came forward to support the flood affected communities by providing direct cash transfer to 170 flood affected families to repair their damaged houses. The cash assistance was directly deposited to the beneficiaries' bank account in two instalments. The launching program was held on 20th January 2016 in Livelihood Training Centre, Kalapet, Pondicherry. His Grace Most Rev. Dr. Antony Anandarayar, the Archbishop of Pondicherry and Cuddalore Archdiocese and President of PMSSS presided over the program and distributed the Caritas India Grant in assistance Cheque to the flood affected beneficiaries.

Community Health Program

The community health program aims at helping the poor sick people in the Archdiocese of Pondicherry and Cuddalore to avail medical care for their cure.

Activities :

- 777 persons from 77 parishes have been received medical treatment during this year.
- 26 persons from other diocese have been benefitted.
- The patients who came for treatment were given TA and DA.
- The patients status were well understood and referred to specialists for early remedy and cure.
- The patients who require accommodation are provided accommodation in PMSSS with regular follow up done.
- Assistance provided to avail Medicines and blood for surgery patients.
- 83 inpatients were referred for medical treatment and surgery returned home after treatment.
- 9 persons undergone cataract operations and 2 persons provided with spectacles.
- 4 persons have undergone ENT surgery.
- 3 persons have undergone Hernia surgery.
- Uterus and Fibroid cyst removed for 2 persons
- Spinal cord injury to a 35 old woman was successfully operated.
- Cyst removed from the head through surgery for a disabled woman.
- Persons met with accidents and persons with bone fractures were provided Instrumental assistance.
- 51 persons have undergone Cataract Surgery, Throat, Kidney, Neck treatment and Tumor surgery.
- PMSSS in association with Uyirthuli organized a blood donation camp and referral services for the patients admitted in JIPMER and Govt. Hospital.
- 2 Patients received Kidney Dialysis treatment.
- Mental health counseling and guidance given to the patients regularly.
- 5 Patients who required MRI, CT, and EEG scan were referred to Govt. Hospitals for free scanning. Patients burden have been considerably reduced through the referral services.

Pondicherry TB Control Programme

754 persons have been tested from 9 PHCs, out of that 38 persons have been identified with TB, received DOTS tablets. The patients are instructed about the usage of tablets and the details of the intake of food. Regular awareness programme, medical counseling and guidance is organized and conducted for the rural masses for early identification and cure.

FLS Home for the Mentally Ill

Fraternal Life Service Home continues to rehabilitate orphans, disadvantaged mentally ill persons since 15.08.1983.

Activities :

1. Regular medication and counseling support provided.
2. Providing nutritious food, medicine and giving regular Physical, Mental Exercise & Meditation.
3. Bring out the talents like vocal, dance, poetry, drawing skills of Mentally ill persons.
4. Continuous medication and follow up.
5. Taking the inmates to tour, excursion for mental diversion.
6. Providing skill training, marriage counseling, emotional support and guidance to family members for taking better care of the mentally ill persons.

Impacts :

1. 486 persons (188 male and 298 female) rehabilitated during this year.
2. 42 persons rehabilitated and sent back home. At present 42 inmates are receiving rehabilitation assistance.
3. FLSH continues to function with the donations received in cash and kind from individual philanthropist and Govt. Departments.

Fraternal Life Communities

FLC was started through leadership training for implementing village level developmental plan and promoting fraternity among members. These rural credit unions are federated into 10 zonal federations at the vicariates levels. The FLCs are engaged in mobilizing savings from members and granting loans to the members from their savings at a very less interest rate, undertake micro enterprise, self employment, Income Generation Project and Life Insurance etc for their well being and developing their socio economic status. FLS functions with an objective of promoting unity among members irrespective of caste, religion and creed.

CBR Mainstreaming Program

PMSSS works for the socially excluded, economically poor and vulnerable communities. The disabled persons in the vulnerable families are prone to various challenges and constraints in the family and in the society. Eventhough the government tries to bring various development measures through welfare programme there are still persons who are not in a position to avail those benefits. Hence in order to address the gaps, PMSSS started implementing CBR Mainstreaming Programme by breaking the physical and attitudinal barriers and to ensure equality, justice in the family and the society.

Implemented Activities :

- Identified Disabled and formed groups in selected 20 parishes who are not members in any groups.
- Programme coordinator and 4 disabled persons of Villupuram and Pondicherry federations participated in South India Regional DPO workshop.
- Parish level commissions and core committee meetings conducted at regular intervals.
- School dropouts children are re-enrolled and special children are admitted in special schools.
- Capacity building programme of Group leaders was conducted on September 9th and 10th by CBR Forum. 20 members participated and learnt about federation structures, Rights of disabled, Schemes related to disabled persons and Leadership qualities.
- CBR- MS partners meet conducted in PGSS Gorakpur, in which partners shared their one year activity and were exposed to project villages of PGSS.
- Facilitation visit by CBR Forum in Puducherry, Villupuram and Cuddalore district and reviewed the functioning of the groups and activities at parish level.
- On 17.12.2015, 35 persons from Kandi Archdiocese of Srilanka came for an exposure visit to PMSSS.

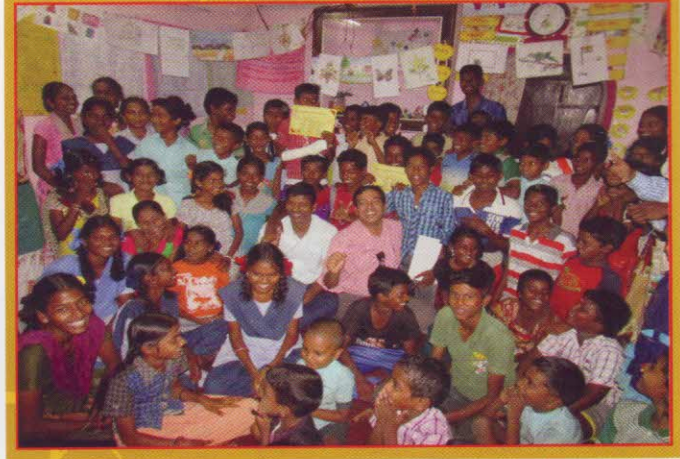

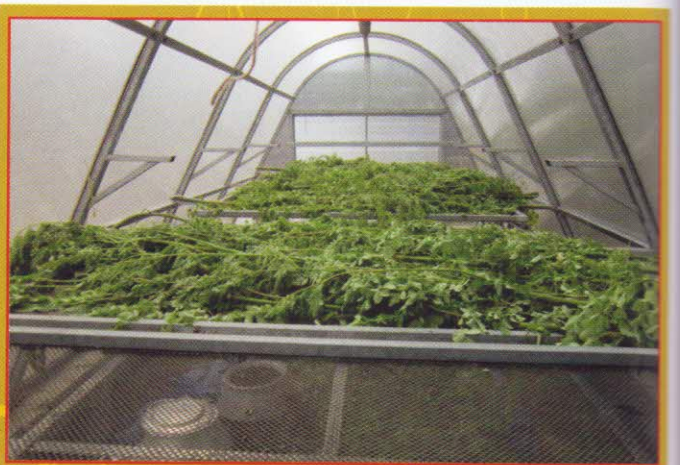

- World Disabled Day was celebrated at four district levels in which Disabled Persons actively participated and exhibited their talents.

Impacts :

- Mr. John Peter was awarded with Samarthiya 2016 award for leadership quality in Integrated School Education and Livelihood options workshop conducted in St. Joseph College, Bangalore. Mr. Selvaraj, Program Organizer participated in the event.
- Ms. Arokiamary participated in the Southern Regional Federation meeting of disabled persons.
- Mr. S. P. Kalaiarasan (LD) from Seruval village of Villupuram District was elected as a member of District level Coordination group and received an invitation from district rehabilitation office to participate in a meeting.
- Disabled persons participated in a hunger strike to raise the pension amount and succeeded.
- Disabled persons of Puducherry, Cuddalore and Villupuram districts continue to protest and advocate for disabled right and entitlements.
- Marriage alliance program for disabled persons was conducted in which 30 disabled persons participated.
- Parish level sports day conducted through continuous facilitation in which disabled persons were encouraged to participate and won prizes.
- Special prayer offered on the World Disable Day in which disabled persons actively participated in spiritual activities.
- Special prayer offered on monthly and yearly basis.
- 10 disabled persons are enrolled in parish commissions and 41 disabled persons have availed Govt. schemes and benefits.

Child Development Project

PMSSS partner with Childfund International USA to implement Child Development Project since October 2014 with an objective to support child education through sponsorship and implement development interventions for the welfare of the families. At present 423 children in 14 villages are benefitted through this program.

Program Activities :

- Puducherry fall under Letter Translation Exchange(LTE) from 1st March 2016. As per the guidance from ChildFund agreement was made with 4 translators to do translation of vernacular letters from Children. Online submission of child documents is done on regular basis through data bank.
- 1222 letters received from zonal level for translation and submission to the donors.
- PMSSS received "0 delinquency status"(sending the letters in time) and received appreciation from ChildFund.

- Rs. 8,54,903.95 received as donations from Donors for 509 children.
- 3 quarterly sponsor family meetings conducted. Letter writing to tap the sponsors, Proper utilization of gift money (DF) with Photograph, Donor portal letter, ensure the Participation of children in project activities/programs, completion of letters within time frame were discussed. 1608 children, parents and siblings participated and thanked their sponsor for their humanitarian support.
- Children club formed in 14 villages with 248 children as its members. The members initiate small development interventions and plan important events to be celebrated during their regular meetings in Child Resource Centers. Each member save Rs. 5 to Rs. 10 for organizing and conducting events and programs at village level.
- 167 Children were taken to exposure visit to Post Office, Police Station, Child Protection cell, Museum, Library, Science Planetarium.
- 153 Solar Lanterns were distributed to enrolled children with the help of ChildFund as part of Books my Friends –Phase 2 campaign called “Ujjwal Bhavishya ki Ore”, – Towards a Brighter Future, The Chief Functionary of PMSSS and Mr. Veerapan, Second Zonal level Inspector of School Education distributed the Lanterns.
- 143 Children Task Force members gained knowledge on first aid techniques during disasters.
- 2 Quarterly and 2 half yearly meeting conducted by Child protection committee to ensure and advocate for care and protection of children in 14 villages. The CPC functions with 101 members.
- Life skill Education conducted for the 3365 children in the age group of 13 to 15. Children learnt about attitudinal and moral values.
- 10 CRCs continues to engage children to develop their academic, inter personal, extra curricular skill activities like clay modeling, recycling from waste, handicrafts, etc were taught to children.
- General health camp conducted for Elders in 14 intervention areas on 29th and 31st of October 2015. 365 men & women benefitted.
- Village level assessment conducted to identify the educational status and the employability skills of 500 youth.
- 100 youth trained on Computer Operations, Tally, Cell phone mechanism, Tailoring, Beautician, 4 wheeler driving.
- Youth groups reorganized in 14 villages, accordingly 15 groups formed with 239 as its members. The members meet regularly and advocate for remedial measures.
- Rs. 5000 given as educational assistance to youth studying Diploma and Degree courses.
- Career guidance workshop conducted for youth to avail educational opportunities present in arts, science, technical and nursing courses. 43 students participated.
- 50 youth were trained in self employment trades.
- 200 youth trained on Resume preparation and Interview techniques.
- Women's day was Celebrated on 16th March 2016 at Thavalakuppam field office. PMSSS, Executive Director was the Chief Guest. 91 Women from 14 villages participated.

- Eye camp conducted with the help of Aravind Eye hospital. 60 children participated of which 30 children tested for eye defects, 3 children referred for regular check up (physical exercise), 7 children received spectacles, 1 child received Eye drops and 1 child was given tablets for eye problem.
- General & Skin check up camp was conducted in association with Arupadai Veedu Medical College & Hospital, Kirumambakkam on 12th March 2016 in which 40 children tested for general health. Dental checkup camp was conducted in association with Arupadai Veedu Medical College & Hospital, Kirumambakkam on 30th September 2015. 63 children benefitted by this camp.
- Baseline survey conducted during the month of March 2016 for 500 households and information on Household, Schools, SMC and Villages collected and sent to NO.
- Free legal awareness camp organized by Child Protection Committee members of Nonankuppam in collaboration with Union Territory of Puducherry Legal Services Authorities. Chief Justice of Puducherry, Judicial Magistrates, were present during the legal awareness camp. 300 children, youth and community people participated in which 150 applications were submitted for marriage registration, 15 people submitted the application for Name change and 23 people submitted the application for Legal heir certificate.

Meetings :

- PMSSS Chief Functionary and Project Manager participated in Child Fund International partners meet in Bangalore on 8th September 2015.
- Children rally on right to education was flagged off by Chief functionary and Social welfare minister Mr. Rajavelu on 14th November 2015 at beach road. 467 children participated in the rally.
- Chief Functionary attended the meeting at Bangalore to discuss new funding model for FY17.

- Workshop on addressing sexual violence against children – (life stage 2- Handling children group 6-14 years) conducted. Project Manager and 2 staff attended this workshop held in Chennai from September 14th & 15th 2015.
- Training on child protection : PMSSS Team was chosen to impart training on child protection to the Staff of TN partners on 28th & 29th September 2015. Mr. Sri Manikandakumar, M&E coordinator, Child Fund Bangalore National Office facilitated the training program.
- Mr. Wilson, SR Coordinator and Mrs. Kalvi, MIS coordinator attended SR refresher training in Bangalore on 1st and 2nd of September 2015.
- Training on child protection imparted to 10 child resource center (CRC) staff.
- On 25th February 2016, 2 staff from Child Development Project attended the Gender workshop in Bangalore.

Linkages with other NGOs :

Children Creatothon 2015 :

On 14th November 2015, Children's Day Celebration conducted, 21 children participated in pot painting, rock painting, making models with scrap and martial arts (Both Tamil Nadu and Puducherry state).

16 children participated in the competition and won 1st to 3rd prize. The prize distribution held on 19th December 2015 at Kamban Kalaingarangam, Puducherry in the presence of Puducherry District Collector, Thiru. Manikandan, Tmt. Muthammal, Secretary Art and Culture, and Mr. James Vasanthan, Vijay TV Anchor. The winners received Appreciation certificate and memento.

Kids Carnival :

In coordination with Deshna Foundation, a NGO working in Pondicherry, Child Development Project children out showed their talents in “Kids Carnival” through various competitions like clay modelling trash to treasure, problem solving, colouring, gunny race, puzzle solving, balloon blast etc., 20 (Enrolled : 13 , Non enrolled : 7) children participated in the competition. Our project children won over all best performance mementos with certificate among 8 NGOs participated.

Monitoring and Evaluation Visits :

- Ms. Smitha Mundodi, Point person from ChildFund International USA, Bangalore visited PMSSS from 9th to 11th February 2016. She reviewed and evaluated the program activities.
- Mr. Biswarup Banerjee (Technical Advisor LS 2), Mr. Ashok Kumar Panda (Zonal Manager – BZO) and Sonia Dominica, Program coordinator LS- 2 from ChildFund International USA, Bangalore visited Child Development Project, Puducherry on 26th February 2016. During the consultation visit the team interacted with the children and families, CPC members and other stakeholders.

Achievements and Impacts :

- CPC members of Nonankuppam had consultation with the Principal of Government Higher Sec. School and started providing lunch to the 10th grade public examination appearing students on Saturdays who attend special class on those days.
- CPC members of Thavalakuppam were responsible for registering sexual abuse case against a youth abused a 3 years old girl child.
- CPC members took lead role in intervening eloping cases and involved in emotional support guidance and helped the girl child to complete her education.
- 108 students appeared for 10th Public examination, out of which 97 students successfully promoted to higher education.
- 47 students appeared for 12th Public examination, out of which 38 students successfully promoted.

Information and Communication Technology Programme

PMSSS started ICT as tool for People Development in the year 2005 as a pilot project. PMSSS has been implementing various technology intervention programs in collaboration with Government and private institutions.

Indian National Center for Ocean Information Services (INCOIS) :

PMSSS in collaboration with Indian National Center for Ocean Information Services (INCOIS), Hyderabad and National Institute of Oceanography (NIO), Goa, has been disseminating Sea wave height, wave direction, wind speed and direction and also deployed Wave Rider Buoy from 2008.

The information from BUOY is recorded at PMSSS headquarters through VHF antenna fixed in the Wave Rider Buoy and also in PMSSS office. In the month of September 2015, Mr. Ramesh from INCOIS serviced the wave rider buoy and re-deployed at the sea shore. This information is disseminated through Local TV channels, SMS network.

Skill Development Programme

PMSSS has established Skill Development Training Centers in Pondicherry and Karaikkal districts in the UT of Pondicherry, Cuddalore and Viluppuram districts in Tamil Nadu State. The young educated people are not in a position of being employed and getting better job opportunities. Reason being, they have not acquired specified skills essential for requirement of the job market. It is noted that there is a big gap between the educated unemployed youth and the employer.

Skill development is the key for economic growth. In order to support Indian economic development and to minimize this gap between the unemployed and the employer, PMSSS decided to organize Skill development program to employ the unemployed youth. PMSSS has tie up with below mentioned State and Central Government Institutions.

NABARD :

National Agricultural Bank for Rural Development (NABARD), Under Ministry of Rural Development has sponsored 13 days Micro Enterprises Development Program (MEDP) in Advanced Beautician for 90 Self Help Group Members in Pondicherry area. Most of them are doing Self Employment.

Also in collaboration with NABARD, Cuddalore organized Financial Literacy Awareness Program (FLAP) to create awareness about the loan facilities and the government schemes. More than 100 Self Help Group members and the general public took part and benefitted.

NI-MSME :

National Institute for Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises, Hyderabad under Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises, Govt. of India in collaboration with PMSSS conducted Entrepreneurship Skill Development Program for the unemployed youth and women in Pondicherry, Karaikal, Cuddalore and Villupuram from 2013. 30 students enrolled in each batch. Those who are willing to go for job or start Self Employment only enrolled in this ESDP program.

Age limit is 18-35years. Education qualification 8th / 10th / 12th / Degree / Diploma. Students can get the training on a full time or part time basis. Certificate will be issued by the Sector Skill Council and the National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC). By this training program the youth will get a better future.

INDSETI:

Indian Bank Self Employment Training Institute (INDSETI) in collaboration with PMSSS conducted Free Skill Training Program to the Rural youth. In 2015, Web Designing training was given to 25 students, 70% of them got placement in various IT institutions.

MSME TREAD:

Trade Related Entrepreneurship Assistance and Development (TREAD) Scheme for Women enabled PMSSS to conduct Tailoring and Aariya Work Training, Bridal Blouse and saree painting and Beautician for 60 self help group members. 20 members attended training in each course. Loan is under process with Indian Bank

Usha Silai School Programme

PMSSS with support of USHA international extended the agreement for existing Puducherry and Cuddalore Silai schools for 2016-17. Agreement made with UIL for 180 Satellite Silai School to be opened in Puducherry & Villupuram Districts. The schools to be opened after the training given by UIL.

Cuddalore District :

Usha International School extended its agreement with PMSSS to start new Silai schools in Cuddalore District. The agreement made as on February 2016. Totally 20 women finalized from the applications received and attended 7 days residential training.

7 days Residential Training :

Residential training to 20 women conducted from 15th to 21st February 2016 at PMSSS Livelihood Training Centre. The Training was inaugurated by Executive Director of PMSSS, Project Coordinator, Mr. Vadivelan, UIL present during the occasion. The training was conducted as per the UIL syllabus with master trainer. Executive Director of PMSSS distributed sewing machines free of cost and blessed the beneficiaries on the concluding day of training.

Silai School Inauguration :

Women started Silai Schools at village level after completion of the training. PMSSS, Director inaugurated and blessed Silai Schools at Veerareddikuppam (2 schools), Ko. Pavazhankudi (1 school), R. C. Kanniyankuppam (1 school), Pennadam (1 school).

Visit by UIL coordinator :

On 27th January 2016, Mr. Vadivelan, Project Coordinator visited the Villupuram Silai School and had discussion with Director about the functioning and future of Silai Schools on 28th January 2016.

Distribution of New Sewing Machine for Pilot study :

PMSSS received 2 new sewing machines one each for Pondicherry and Villupuram Silai school to conduct pilot study. The brand name is USHA NOVA which is yet to be introduced in the market. The company asked the teachers of these 2 schools to keep a record of the functioning of this machine, advantages and disadvantages so that necessary modifications can be done before it is marketed. Similarly, the teachers regularly record the overall status on the functioning of the machines. UIL agreed to give these 2 machines to the schools in future.

Saree & Bridal Blouse Designs training :

15 women attended the training on saree & bridal blouse designing in collaboration with Trade Related Entrepreneurship Assistance and Development (TREAD) scheme promoted by the Ministry of Micro Small and Medium Enterprises, Government of India. They will also undergo Entrepreneurship Development Program (EDP).

Tailoring Course Training :

5 women attended the Tailoring training conducted in collaboration with Trade Related Entrepreneurship Assistance and Development (TREAD) scheme promoted by the Ministry of Micro Small and Medium Enterprises, Government of India. They will also undergo Entrepreneurship Development Program (EDP).

CHILDLINE 1098 Programme

CHILDLINE is India's first 24 hours, toll free, emergency phone outreach service for children in need of care and protection linking them to long term services for their care and rehabilitation. It is a project supported by the Ministry of Women and Child Development under the overall supervision and guidance of Childline India Foundation. CHILDLINE continues to function with PMSSS being the collaborative organization and IRDC Baby Sarah Home the support organization in the district of Puducherry. 5 years have been passed and a total of more than 1500 children have been intervened. During this year 1744 calls received and 283 cases have been intervened and provided the required support with the help of the Allied Departments and Govt. support structures.

Programme Activities :

Orientation on POCSO Act 2012 for Medical Practitioners :

Two days Orientation on Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act 2012 was organized and conducted by CHILDLINE for the nurses and staff of Rajiv Gandhi Hospital for Women and Child (RGHWC) on 12th and 13th August 2015. Around 140 nurses and staff participated in the training programme.

Open House programme:

6 pre open house programme and 1 open house programme conducted. On 27.02.2016, CHILDLINE Puducherry along with B.R. Ambedkar Children Group organized a open house programme in Moolakulam, Pondicherry. The Hon'ble Local Administration Minister, Puducherry and Chairperson, CWC were invited as Chief Guest. During the programme children of the villages identified issues affecting them and presented a petition to the Hon'ble Minister.

Special Events :

Observation of World Day Against Child Labour :

PMSSS observed International Day Against Child Labour on June 12th 2015. Childline project staff held a two wheeler campaign with their face covered with red cloth to ban and protest against Child labour. The campaign was flagged off by CWC Chairperson. The team holding pluck cards went around important streets of Pondicherry to create awareness on not to employ children.

Cycle Campaign against Child Sexual Abuse :

On 24.07.2015, PMSSS organized a cycle rally protesting against the increasing child sexual abuse in Pondicherry and the need of protecting girl children. 50 students of Private ITI participated in the cycle rally. The rally was inaugurated and flagged off by the Hon'ble Welfare Minister. Childline staff in their two wheelers with an auto in the front with audio set up disseminated the services of Childline project in the important streets of Oulgaret Municipality.

Childline Se Dosti (CSD) Campaign :

Press meet :

On 12.11.2015 PMSSS organized a Press meet and invited media professionals from Puducherry. Rev. Fr. Joseph Arumaiselvam, Director, CHILDLINE Puducherry thanked the media for their continued support. Later the Centre coordinator shared the objective of the CSD campaign and the programme schedule with the media and requested to give wider visibility in media. Around 23 persons from different print and video media participated in the meet. At the end of the meet the media guidelines for reporting child related cases which was sent by CIF was shared and distributed in CD format.

CSD Campaign Inauguration by the District Collector/ Secretary Revenue :

On 13.11.2015, around 40 children sheltered in Jaly home along with CHILDLINE staff met the Puducherry District collector/ Secretary Revenue and shared the Children's Day wishes. Dosti band was tied by the children. He also took the Pledge against child abuse.

Children Creatothon - 2015 :

TYCL, MUGHIL and CHILDLINE Puducherry together organized children's Creatothon-15 in Puducherry Beach on 14th November 2015. Events like Rock Poster Design, Pot Painting, Story Creation, Clay Work, etc conducted. Around 40 children participated in the event. The entire event was captured by Life Style Media, the media partner for the event.

Events Against Child abuse :

- On 14.11.2015 CHILDLINE Puducherry and Child Fund International project beneficiaries participated in the rally against child abuse. Hon'ble Welfare Minister of Puducherry inaugurated the rally. More than 400 children participated in the rally. Children carried messages contained in placards and marched towards important places to create awareness about protection of children. CHILDLINE Puducherry Director, staff participated in the rally.
- On 17.11.2015 Puppet show on Child Rights and Protection was organized in Pitchaveerampet village to create awareness to children and adults in the village. The Puppet show was conducted by Kalaimamani Dr. Dhandapani and group. Themes on child rights, violence, protection, good habit were explained through songs and demonstration. More than 150 children and adults participated in the show.
- On 17.11.2015 the centre coordinator was invited to give a live talk show in a programme titled "Udhavi Karam" in All India Radio's Rainbow FM from 7pm to 8pm. The Centre Coordinator briefed about CHILDLINE 1098 interventions in the Puducherry district and in general about the protection of children.
- On 18.11.2015, CHILDLINE Puducherry organized a signature campaign against child abuse in Puducherry New Bus stand. Mr. Chandran, Senior Superintendent of Police (L & O) inaugurated the signature campaign with his first signature. Dr. Vidya Ramkumar, Chairperson, CWC and Mr. Jagadish, Legal cum Probationary Officer, UTPSCPS participated in the event and made their signature. More than 800 persons made their signatures and participated in the voice against child abuse.

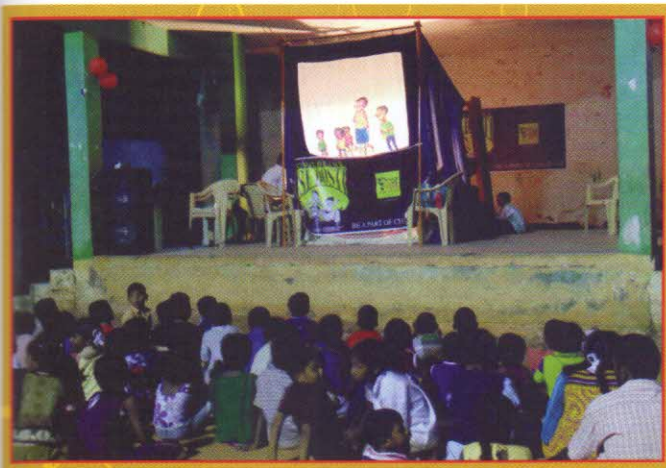

On 31st January 2016, Deshna Foundation and Puducherry CHILDLINE conducted the Kids carnival in Fraternal Life Service Home for MI, Ousteri . More than 205 children from Rural Government schools and children residing in shelter homes participated in various events. The programme envisioned to make the children participate, to create self-confidence in them and make them understand their participation rights.

Sensitization programme on POCSO Act 2012 for Teachers :

On 10.02.2016, Union Territory of Puducherry Legal Service Authority (UTPLSA) organized a Sensitization programme on POCSO Act 2012 for Teachers. Childline Centre Coordinator was invited as one of the resource persons to conduct a session on Child Abuse and Response Management. Around 45 teachers from different govt. schools of Pondicherry District participated in the programme.

Orientation to Human Rights Clubs to Hostel Wardens and Community Volunteers :

On 24.02.2016, HOPE NGO organized an Orientation to Human Rights Clubs to Hostel Wardens and Community Volunteers. Childline Centre Coordinator handled a session on Child Rights Issues in Pondicherry. Around 50 participants ranking from Assistant Director, Welfare Officers to Hostel Incharges from Department of Social Welfare and Adi Dravidar Welfare Department were present. The Programme was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Welfare Minister, Puducherry.

Sensitization Programme on Child Rights and Response Management to Government Teachers :

As an outcome of the Orientation Programme to School Teachers on Child abuse and response management, the State Training Centre of Puducherry invited the CHILDLINE centre coordinator to conduct a sensitization programme on child abuse, POCSO Act 2012 for teachers of Govt. Schools. Training was conducted for 260 teachers in 5 batches.

In each village Special Group Facilitator is appointed to identify the needs and facilitate the PWDs. The project has identified 6890 physically challenged persons and 7191 vulnerable persons so far.

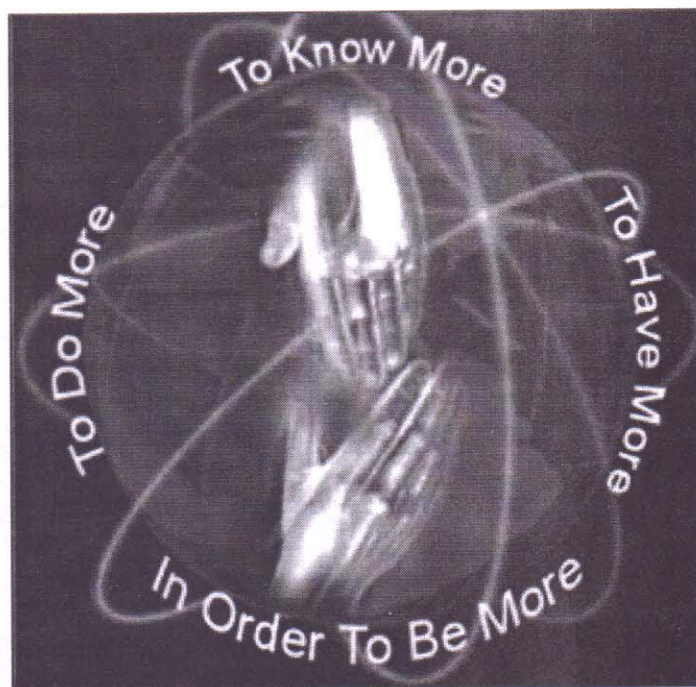
